Covid restrictions has meant that Armed Forces Day is going to be a very different affair this year. Whilst there is a possibility that there could have been a parade and the usual celebrations in Aldershot, the uncertainty has meant that we are planning something different.

Thank you for agreeing to be part of this event. Over the next month or so we hope that your school will plan an assortment of events to celebrate Armed Forces Day, and this art project will be part of that planning.

For this project we are focusing on the Army, as Aldershot is 'The Home of the British Army'. What we want to show is that although the combat part of the Army is so important and we have so many reasons to be tankful to them, there are a lot of other people that make the Army function, and they deserve our thanks too!

Over the next few weeks more information will be heading your way. We realise that teachers are busy people and don't want to swamp you with information, but you also need to know enough to make sure that your planning is thorough and that the whole experience is a valuable educational experience that can be woven into the curriculum ... not just an add on that has little relevance to the young people in your school.
